Easy, the meet may be cancelled. Yes, we want to complain and be grumpy, but the swimmers have worked hard to come to these meets. That's why they have been practicing. They are excited. We have 2 meets to work this year, they work hours a week for about six months. This is their reward for the practice they have done.
